

In Memory...



Sister Teresa Josephine Cotter, DMJ

Born: April 2, 1914 Professed: August 18, 1937 Died: September 22, 2011

Sister Teresa Josephine Cotter was born in Abbeyfeale, Co. Limerick, Ireland, April 2, 1914. Her parents were Eileen and Thomas Cotter. She was the oldest of five children; Eileen, Timothy, Daniel and Nicholas. Teresa Josephine went to Secondary School in Scarborough in the North of England with her two first cousins, Mary Anastasia and Mary William. She and they entered the Daughters of Mary and Joseph in Scarborough. After her profession in 1937, she remained in

England for a couple of years teaching in Forest Hill. In 1939 she boarded a ship in Southampton bound for the United States. Sister Teresa Josephine continued her journey to Los Angeles by train.

Most of Sister Teresa's teaching ministry was with first graders. She taught at Saint Paul the Apostle, Saint Augustine, Our Lady of Peace, Saint James the Less, Saint Anthony, Saint Sebastian, Melodee pre-school and Palms Elementary School.

Sister Teresa Josephine was well known in Culver City. She probably walked most of it during her years of living there. Hail, rain, or shine she walked to Brotman Medical Center for lunch every day and walked to Saint Augustine for Mass. Sister Teresa Josephine had a world view as was evidenced by the prayer list found in her prayer book. She prayed for people in Saint Augustine Parish by name, for youth ministers in Cameroon, members of our Sister's families in Ireland, our Sisters who were ill, and always, the sick, the lonely, the downtrodden, the hungry, and most especially those who were serving our country in Kuwait, Afghanistan, and Iraq.




